





APPle Addition






Depending on your child's abilities, you can gradually increase the difficulty of the puzzle. Start by cutting the puzzle into strips and then into smaller and smaller pieces.




Directional Words and Word Recognition

Print out the following pages {a mini-reader of sorts}.






