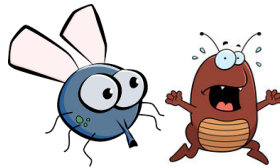
What are limericks?

The origin of the poem's name is a bit disputed, but most people believe it comes from the Irish city of Limerick. 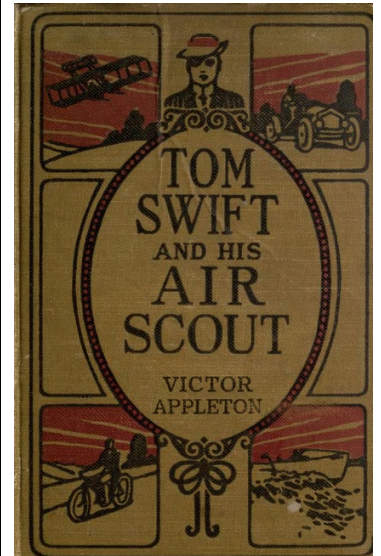

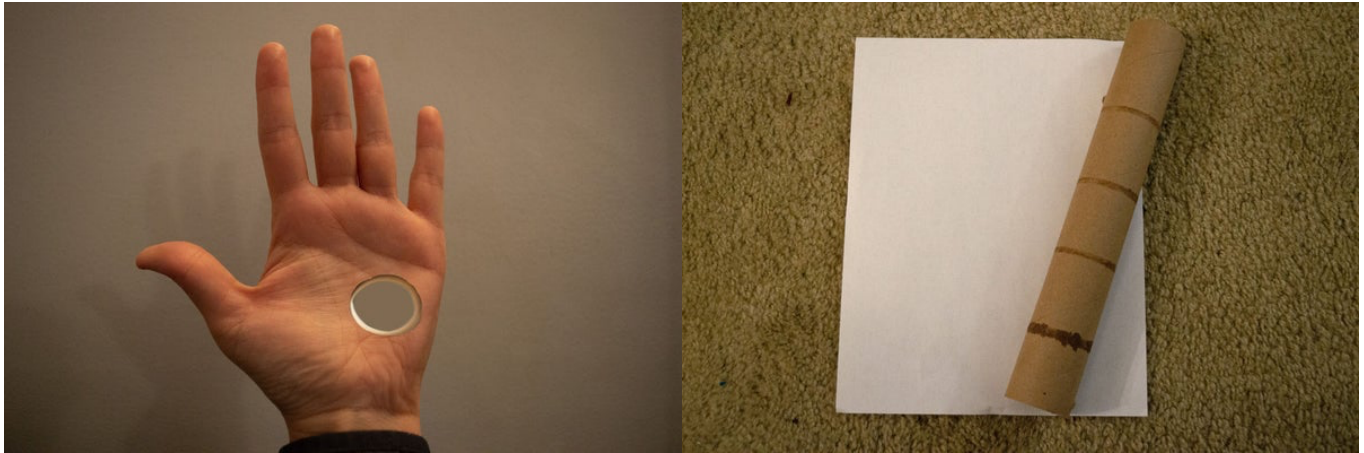

FUN WITH SCIENCE:

MAKE A PAPER TELESCOPE THAT CAN SEE THROUGH YOUR HAND!!!



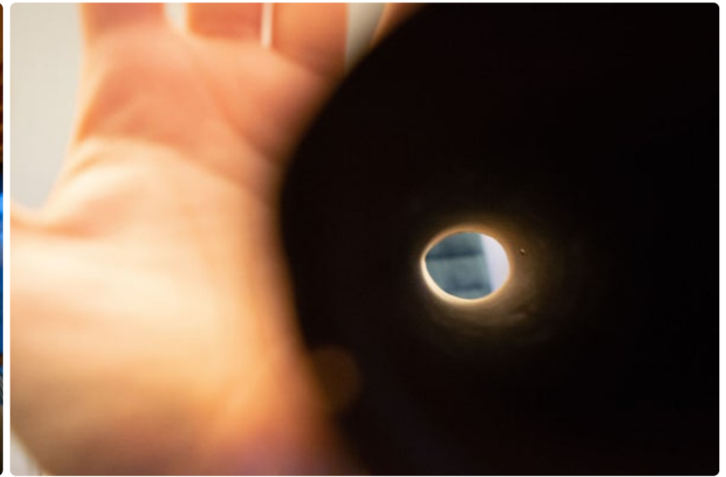
Wait. What?? Can you really build a telescope that sees through your hand? The answer is both yes and no. What you are actually creating is a simple, *brain-bending optical illusion* that makes a "hole" emerge in the palm of your hand.

What you need.

All you need is a narrow tube made out of rolled-up paper. Roll up a piece of plain white paper (8.5x11) along the long edge, with the opening about the size of a nickel or a quarter. Secure it with a piece of Scotch tape. A paper towel or toilet paper tube works too!

How to create the illusion.





Next, hold tube in your right hand up to your right eye. Then, leaving BOTH EYES OPEN, Place your left hand (fingers facing upwards) alongside the tube about 2 inches from your face. For at least 10 seconds, try to focus on the sight in the distance through the tube and not your hand. After a while, it will appear that the hole is in your hand!

Why does this work?

It all has to do with a phenomenon called *binocular rivalry*. Our brain uses the two images it receives from each eye to produce three-dimensional vision. However, if the two images present two very different sights, the brain will suppress one of the images and make the other more dominant – as opposed to creating a totally merged hodgepodge of the images.

In this case, the effect tends to suppress the hand as it's the weaker stimulus and not in focus. However, it doesn't just "black out" the image. Instead, the brain flickers between the images, creating the perception that the sight at the end of the tube is on your hand. Try switching eyes and hands.

Experiment

- Practice using different width tubes. Try rolling a sheet of paper up to about 1/2" diameter. Does it change the effect?
- Try using a toilet paper roll instead of a paper towel roll, or use a shorter length of paper. How does that change the effect?
- Move your hand up the tube closer to your eyes, then further away. What happens now?
- Add the full length paper tube to the shorter toilet paper tube. What effect does that create?
- Change up the shapes of the tubes (maybe make one oval or heart shaped). Does this alter the effect?
- Add and subtract lighting from the environment. Does this alter the effect?
- Add a picture to the end of the tube (keeping it about 1/4" away from the tube, as to let in light so you can see it). What happens now?

SWITCH EYES AND HANDS

Is the effect stronger on one side or the other? Why do you think that is? If you found the effect stronger on one side than the other, it indicates that one eye is likely dominant. What's that mean? It means your brain has a slight preference for visual information from that eye over the other. It's a similar idea to having a dominant hand or foot. However, your dominant eye may not be the same as your dominant hand or foot.



Fancy Pants Mac & Cheese

Ingredients

- 2 cups uncooked **elbow macaroni**
- 1/4 cup **butter**, cubed
- 1/4 cup all-purpose **flour**
- 2 cups **2% milk**
- 4 teaspoons chicken **broth**
- 1/4 teaspoon **pepper**
- 2 cups shredded **cheddar cheese**, divided into separate cups
- 1/4 cup grated **Parmesan cheese**
- 1/2 - full cup **panko bread crumbs**
(if you have /like crispy top)
- 1-1/2 cups chopped ham/cooked ground beef/veggies
(can add if have/want-or
keep it simple and delicious!)



Directions

- Cook macaroni according to package directions - heavily salt water; boil, cook, drain, and set aside.
- In a large saucepan, melt butter over low heat; mix in flour until smooth.
- Whisk in the milk, chicken broth and pepper. Bring to a boil; cook and stir for 2 minutes or until thickened. Remove from the heat.
- Stir in 1 cup cheddar cheese, Parmesan cheese and macaroni.
Optional -- Add ham/bacon/chopped broccoli/ cauliflower or other if you want.
- Transfer to a greased 2-qt. baking dish.
- Sprinkle with remaining cheddar cheese and panko.
- Bake, uncovered, at 350° until bubbly, 20-25 minutes.
- Let stand for 5 minutes before serving.

FARM TO TABLE

RAMEN with Farm Fresh Eggs and Spring Vegetables

(serves four)

I particularly love ramen because it's so tasty, and you can get creative with the toppings. Enjoy!

Ingredients

- 1 leek
- 2 tbsp. olive oil
- 4 peeled garlic cloves
- 6 pieces fresh, sliced ginger
- 6 c. chicken broth (*homemade or store bought*)
- ½ c. soy milk (*optional*)
- 4 packets fresh ramen noodles
- 2 c. corn kernels (*fresh or frozen*)
- 4 eggs
- Salt and pepper to taste
- Sesame oil (*for drizzling*)



Topping options

- Pea tendrils
- Scallions
- Squash blossoms

1. Cut leek into quarters, then halves. Sauté in 1 tbsp. olive oil with garlic and ginger over medium heat until dark brown (*about 20 minutes*).
2. Add chicken broth and simmer with sautéed ingredients for about 1 hour. Strain broth to remove leek mixture. Add salt (*to taste*) and soy milk (*optional*).
3. Meanwhile, sauté corn (*or your favorite vegetables*) with remaining 1 tbsp. olive oil and a little sea salt and cook noodles in boiling water until al dente. Drizzle noodles with sesame oil for extra flavor.
4. For perfectly medium-boiled eggs, gently add each egg to a pot of boiling water and cook for 7 minutes. Transfer to an ice bath for 4 minutes, making sure eggs are completely cool before removing. Peel and slice.
5. To curl scallions, cut cleaned and trimmed stalks lengthwise into very thin strips. Add to an ice bath and refrigerate for about an hour.
6. Add corn and ramen to broth. Assemble bowls with toppings or let each family member create his/her own.



Chewy & Goopy Blondies/Chocolate Chip Cookie Bar

You can also customize these with your favorite chocolate chips, nuts or even coconut.

Ingredients

- 1 cup unsalted **butter** (*MELTED*)
- 1 1/4 cup **brown sugar** - * *tightly packed*
- 1/2 cup **sugar**
- 2 large **eggs** + 1 egg **yolk** - *at room temperature for best results*
- 2 teaspoons **vanilla extract**
- 2 1/2 cups **all-purpose flour**
- 2 teaspoons **cornstarch**
- 1/2 teaspoon **baking powder**
- 1 teaspoon **salt**
- 2/3 cup **white chocolate chips**
 - or **Semi-sweet** if not a fan of white
 - you can also add nuts if you like.



Instructions

1. Preheat oven to 350F and line a 13x9 pan with parchment paper**
2. Combine melted butter and sugar in a large bowl and stir well.
3. Add eggs, egg yolk, and vanilla extract and stir until completely combined. Set aside.
4. In a separate bowl, whisk together flour, cornstarch, baking powder, and salt.
5. Gradually stir dry ingredients into wet until completely combined.
6. Fold in white chocolate chips or other chips, if using instead.
7. Spread blondie batter into prepared pan and transfer to oven.
8. Bake on 350F for 25-30 minutes*** or until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean or with a few fudgy crumbs.
9. Allow to cool before cutting and enjoying.

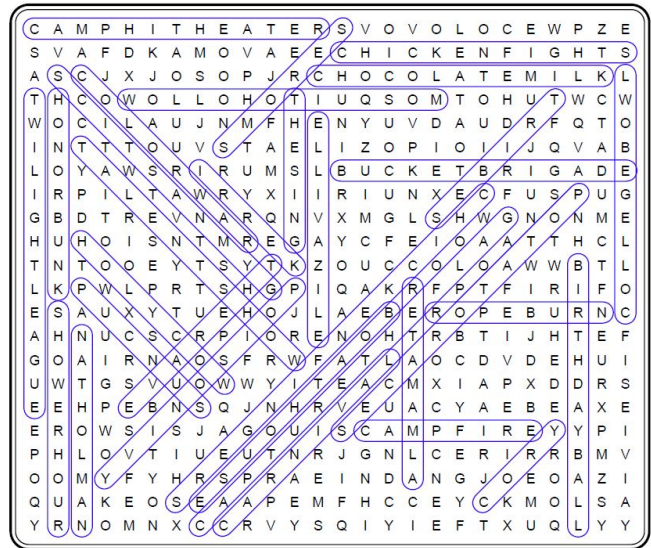
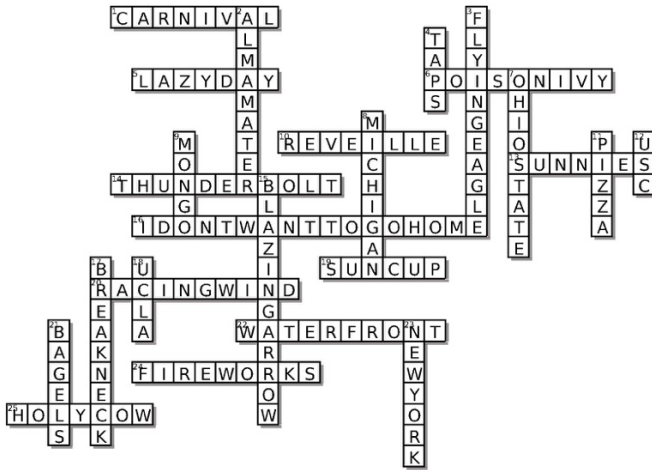
Notes

- *** *If you use a glass pan it will likely take a few minutes longer than the suggested time to bake*

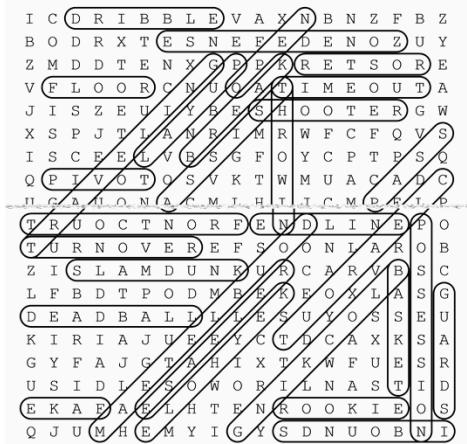

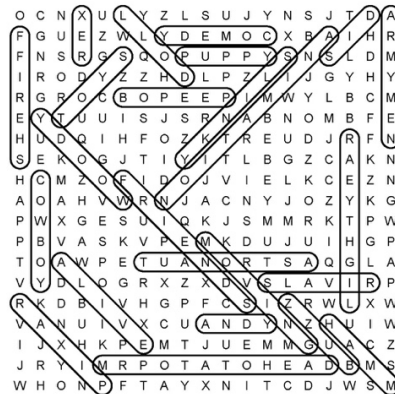

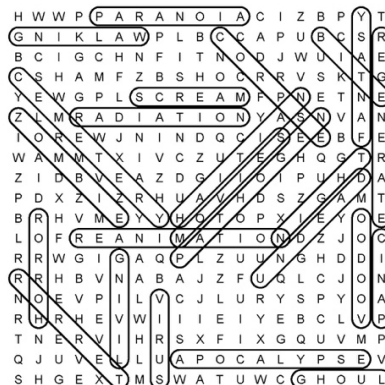
